Silke Schwandt, In her research and teaching activities as Professor for Digital History at Bielefeld University, Silke Schwandt addresses these challenges on three levels: in the theorisation of digital history, in its methods and practices, as well as in its dissemination in academic teaching and to society. Seizing and utilizing the possibilities of digital media for researching the relation of space and time is one of her research foci. Silke Schwandt also develops creative and innovative formats with a focus on Data Literacy as well as new digital publication formats.

Laura Niewöhner, Laura Niewöhner is a PhD student in the INF "Data Infrastructure and Digital Humanities" sub-project at Bielefeld University, where she is working on digital methods in the humanities. Her PhD project focuses on denazification trials in Germany after the Second World War. Here she focuses in the design and analysis of relational databases.
