










In the eighteenth century, many high-ranking Ottoman dignitaries identified "sciences and arts" as key to the military success of European powers. For the Ottoman reformers to bring the Empire upto-date was to involve more or less systematic efforts to create, import, adopt and adapt technology. My keynote speech presents a mosaic-like overview of the complex and multilayered interaction of the Ottomans with modern technology in the long nineteenth century, focusing particularly on governmental action, configuration of expert discourses and transformations of everyday life.
